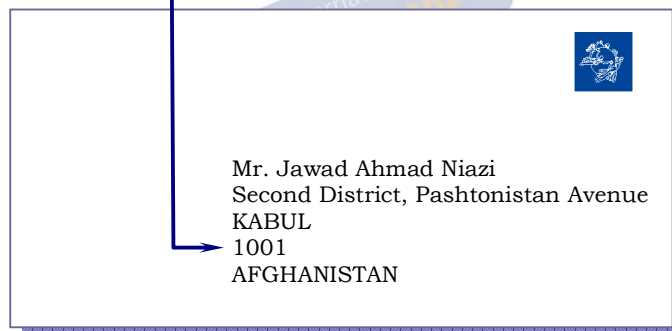
4 digits below the province name.

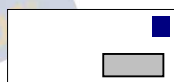

## Address format

A new four digits postcode system came into force on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2011. The country is divided into 34 provinces. The postcode for provinces ranges between 10 and 43. The city/delivery zone ranges between 01 and 50, whereas the district/delivery zone falls in the 51-99 range.
