Hungary (Rep.) – Non-denominated stamps

Dear Sir/Madam

The postal administration of the **REPUBLIC OF HUNGARY** asks me to inform you that on 16 July 2007, Magyar Posta issued four different sheets of personalized stamps, each containing 20 or 35 non-denominated stamps featuring the following motifs: birth, pens, door knockers and Budapest (labels may be personalized). Stamps bearing the inscription "Belföld" may be used as standard domestic-rate stamps. The same stamps will also be issued as regular postage stamps.

These non-denominated stamps may be used in combination with other stamps for the prepayment of postage on international items. Magyar Posta asks its postal partners to consider the postage on these items as having been duly prepaid.

Detailed description of the stamp sheets:

"My first stamp" stamp sheet, containing 20 standard domestic-rate stamps
Twenty alternating stamp designs featuring symbols of birth: rattle, duckling, baby shoes (booties) in blue and pink.

"Message II" stamp sheet (pens), containing 20 or 35 standard domestic-rate stamps

Twenty different stamp designs depicting the history of writing implements.

"Message III" stamp sheet (door knockers), containing 20 or 35 standard domestic-rate stamps

Ten alternating stamp designs featuring different types of door knockers.

"City of Budapest" stamp sheet, containing 20 standard domestic-rate stamps Five different stamp designs featuring the sights of Budapest (Chain Bridge, Parliament, Buda Castle, Heroes' Square and Fishermen's Bastion).
