Hong Kong, China – Issue of postage stamps without face value

Dear Sir/Madam

The postal administration of **HONG KONG, CHINA** asks me to inform the postal administrations of Union member countries of the issue, on 28 December 2007, of a set of "Heartwarming" special stamps without indication of the face value. These stamps bear the inscription "Local Mail Postage" or "Air Mail Postage", and are intended for prepayment of a local or airmail letter respectively weighing up to their first weight steps, irrespective of future postage revisions.

These stamps may be used in combination with other valid Hong Kong postage stamps for prepayment of postage in the local and international services.

Hongkong Post requests that destination member countries consider postal items bearing such stamps or combinations of such stamps as having been duly prepaid. Such items should be handled and delivered normally in their countries, unless they bear the "T" indication of insufficient payment.

These stamps are shown in the annex.
