

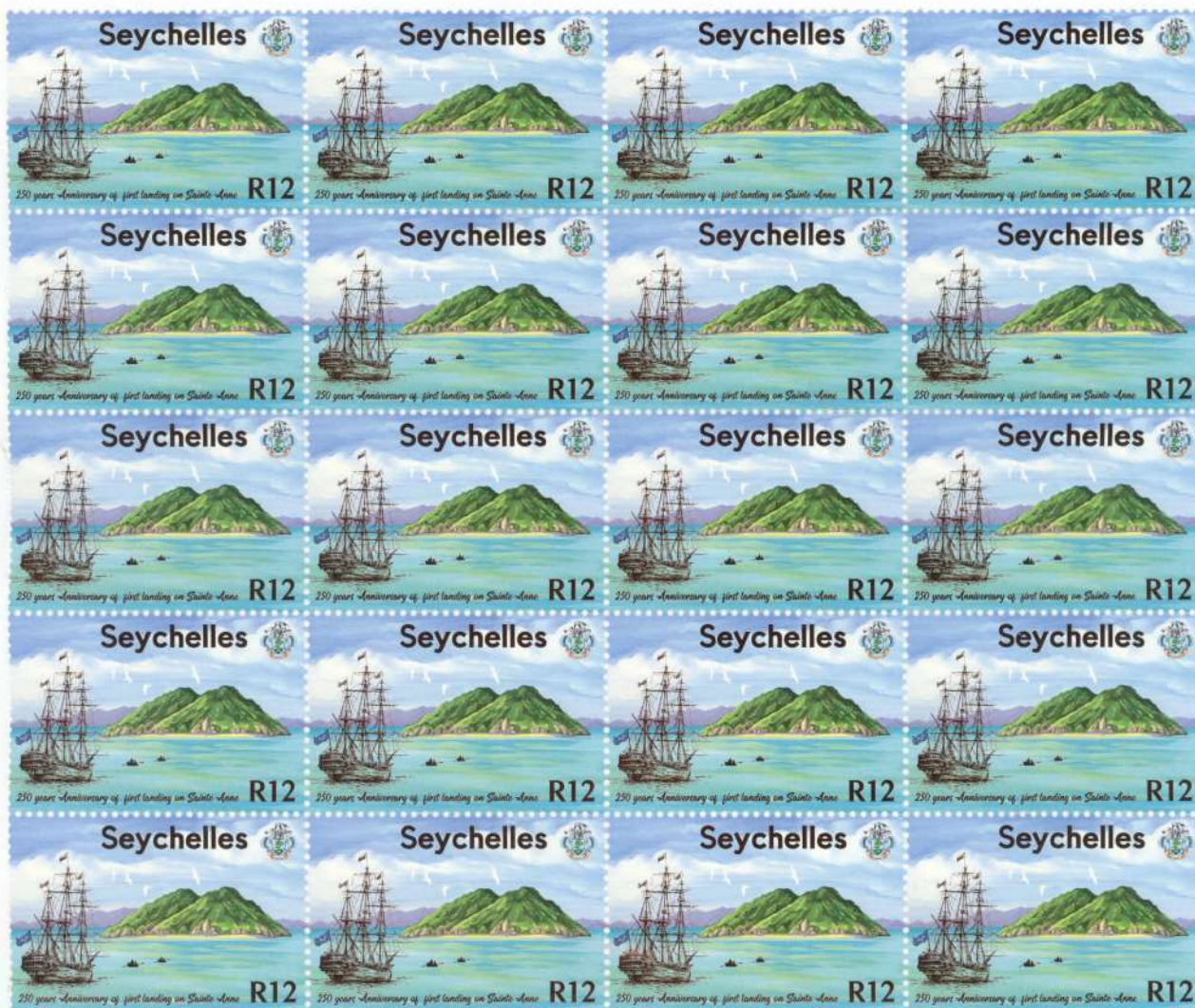

Our first stamp in this collection takes you back to the year 1770 when the *Thélèmaque* dropped anchor off the coast of Sainte Anne island. Known as the first settlers of the Seychelles islands, the group consisted of 28 people—a mixture of Europeans, Indians and Africans. The stamp is a commemorative work of art, celebrating 250 years of the island nation's origins.



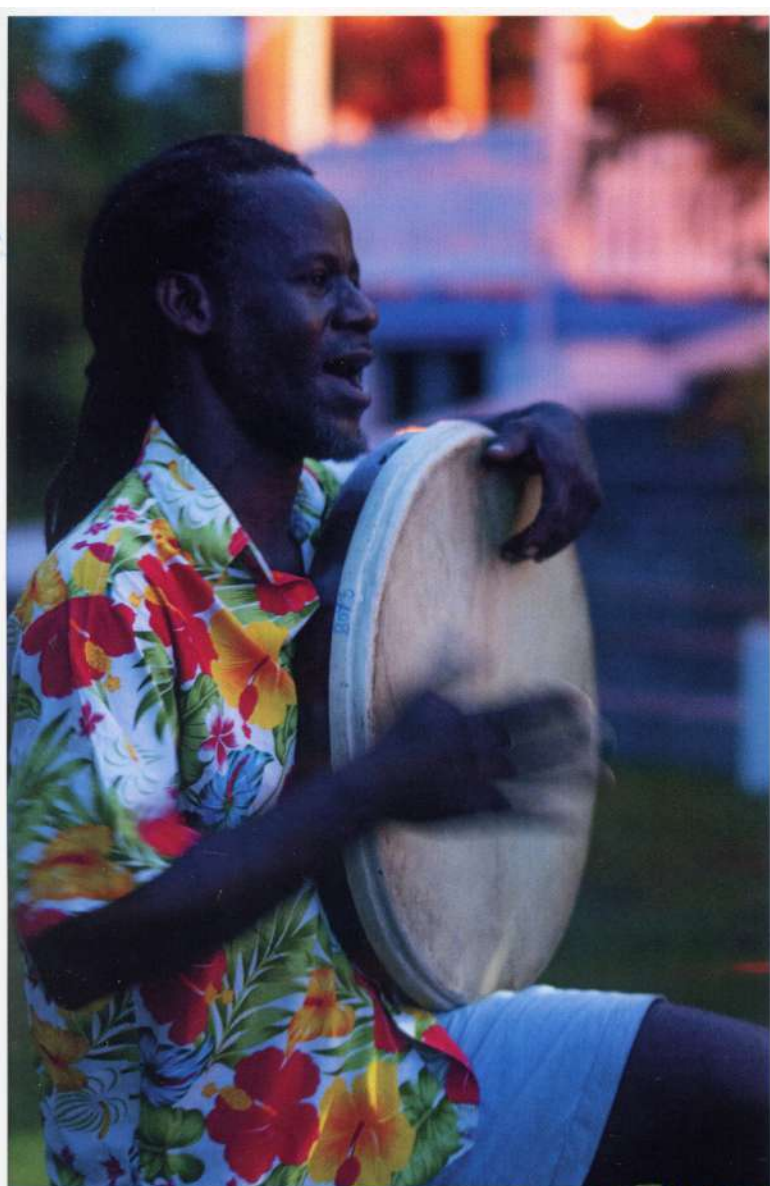
Nestled between blue skies and emerald waters, the Seychelles International Airport has been the gateway between Seychelles and the rest of the world since 1972.
